Pg. 58; (#6)...any <u>new</u> algae toxin assessment criteria is akin to giving 'somebody' the right to turn off massive water supplies using surface water sources...or a power that has not been <u>ever</u> granted previously under formerly 'accepted' levels of any toxin whatsoever. A surface water customer can always treat his water. If he does not *receive* said water in the first place due to any number of regulatory factors previously outlawed?..his water will (1) necessarily be much more expensive or (2) possibly even tragically **unavailable** by today's long accepted standards.

"..."; (#7)...putting the above unbridled power and toxin level oversight in to the hands of the **federal** government is a recipe for disaster and yet another intentional usurpation of local control. "..."; (#8)...playing 'God' with natural resources for the sake of water <u>quantity</u> is not to battle *climate*

change, but to assert control.

"..." (**#9**)...the 'final solution' to force traditional local (individual/local government) control of our most valuable resource to be (finally) put under <u>state</u> control...period.

"..."; **(#13)**...all that you really need to know. This is where all of this is going in terms of any "water withdrawal assessment process"...or **'who will be King and who will not'** using <u>water</u> as a currency/gun to Michigan citizen's heads.

The (new) MAEAP standard (finally) 'reigns supreme' at MDARD (or the cat is effectively let out of the bag):

Pg. 60; (#18)....Agricultural land use <u>will</u> *<u>directly</u>* follow MAEAP guidelines <u>and</u> participation criteria to remain consistent with the state's recent efforts.

Environmental Protection Agency pressed forward with its new water pollution rules on Friday, saying a court ruling blocking them from going into effect applied <u>only</u> to 13 states that brought the case. **Michigan is NOT among them**, our waterways, wetlands, and ditches are now effectively under the control of a Federal agency - the EPA.

As WSJ reported, U.S. District Judge Ralph Erickson of North Dakota on Thursday evening issued a preliminary injunction against the regulations, which seek to put more small bodies of water and wetlands under federal protection. The judge agreed with the states suing the Obama administration that the regulations overreached by giving the federal government control over ditches and streams remote from navigable waters where it has jurisdiction.

The Hill reports on the latest development:

[T]he EPA is interpreting the North Dakota decision to apply only in the states involved in the litigation.

"The Clean Water Rule is fundamental to protecting and restoring the nation's water resources that are vital for our health, environment, and economy," EPA spokeswoman Melissa Harrison said. "EPA and the Department of the Army have been preparing to implement the rule on the effective date of August 28."

The preliminary injunction, Harrison said, applies <u>only</u> in Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Idaho, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, South Dakota and Wyoming. "In all other respects, the rule is effective on August 28," she said. "The agencies are evaluating these orders and considering next steps in the litigation."
